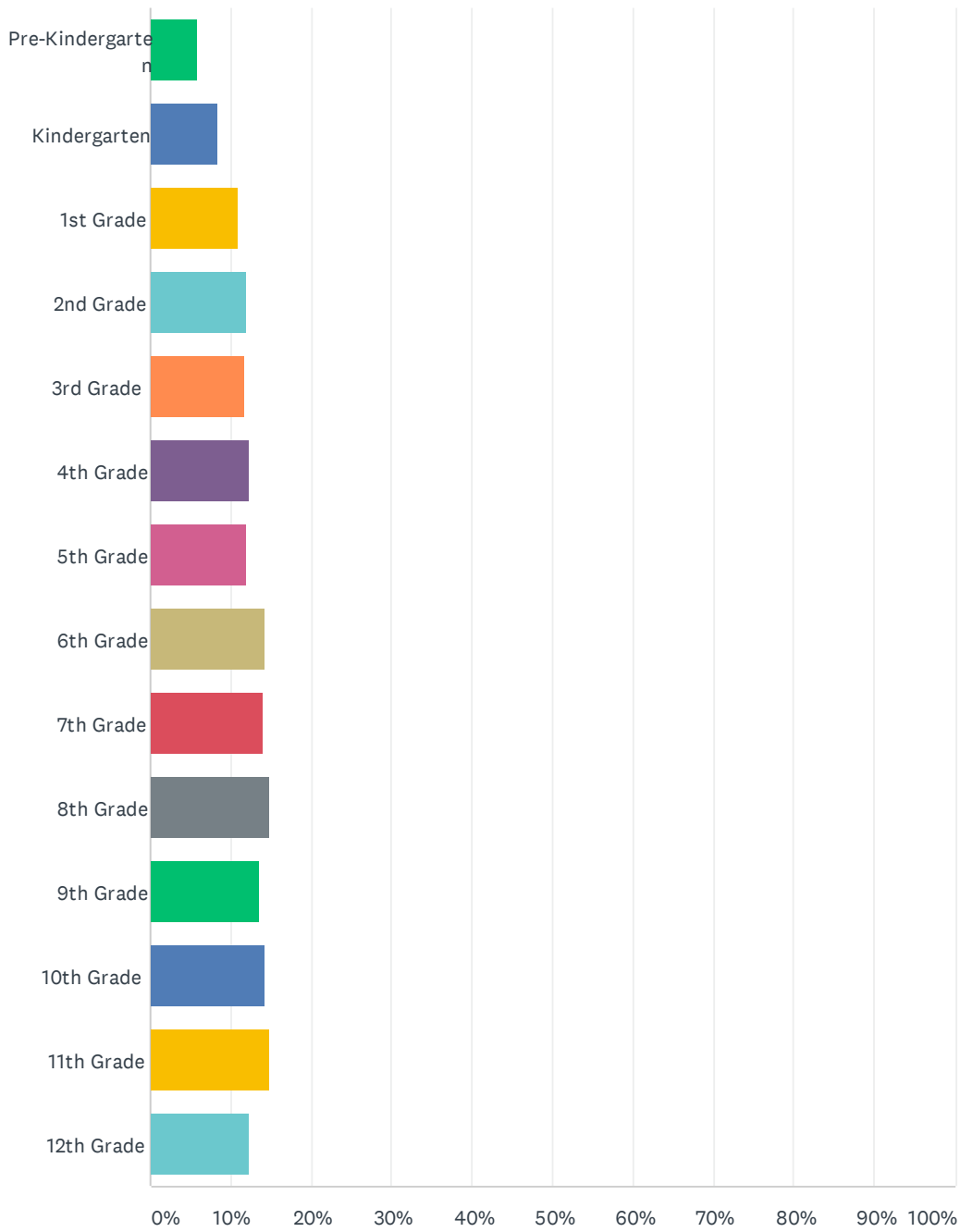

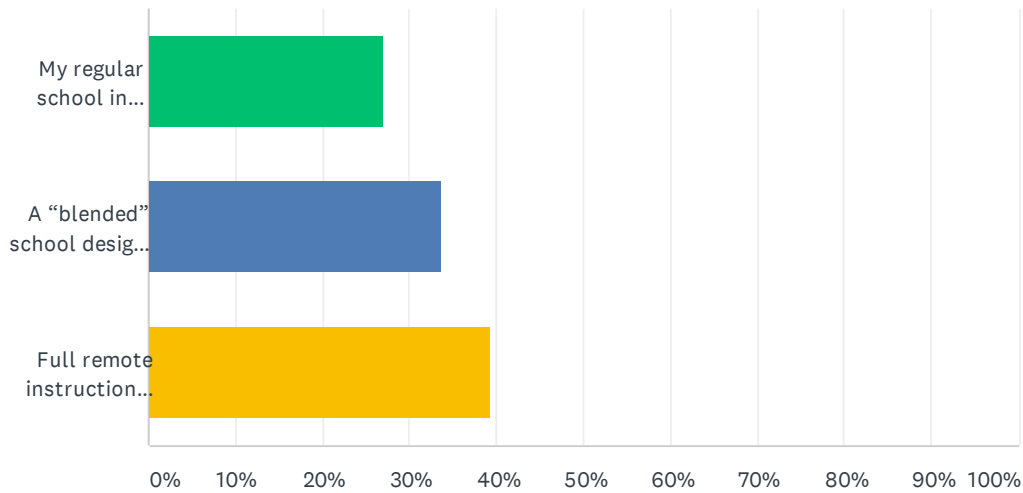

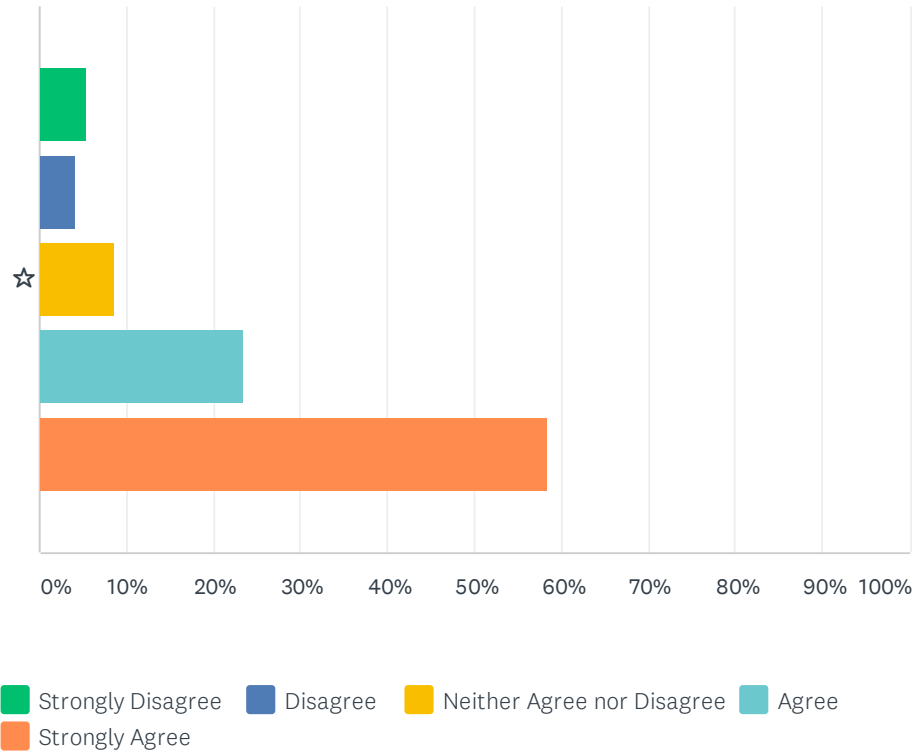

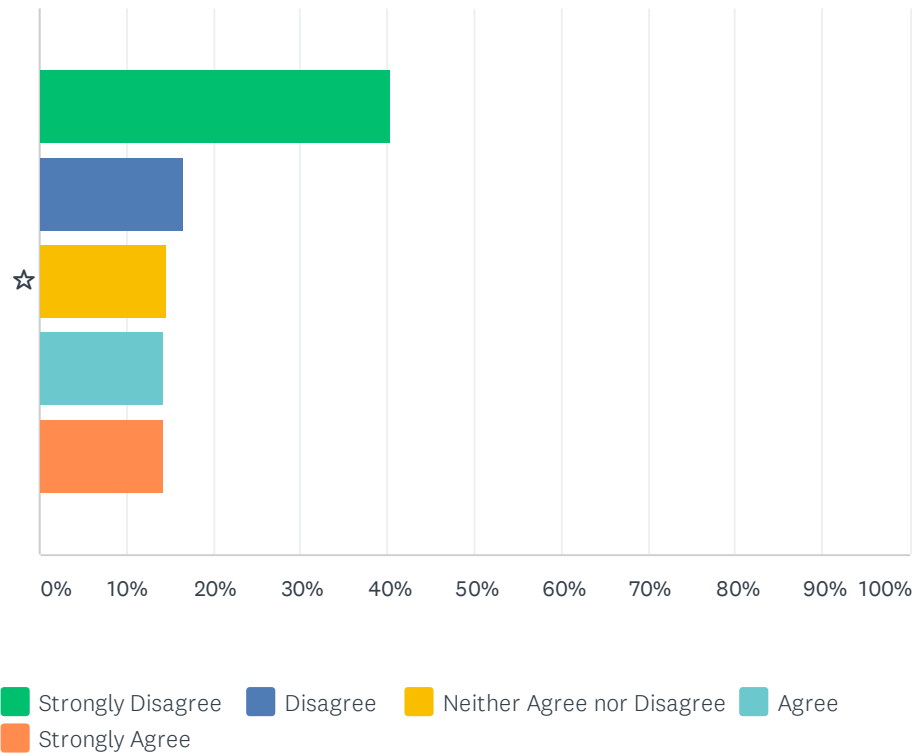

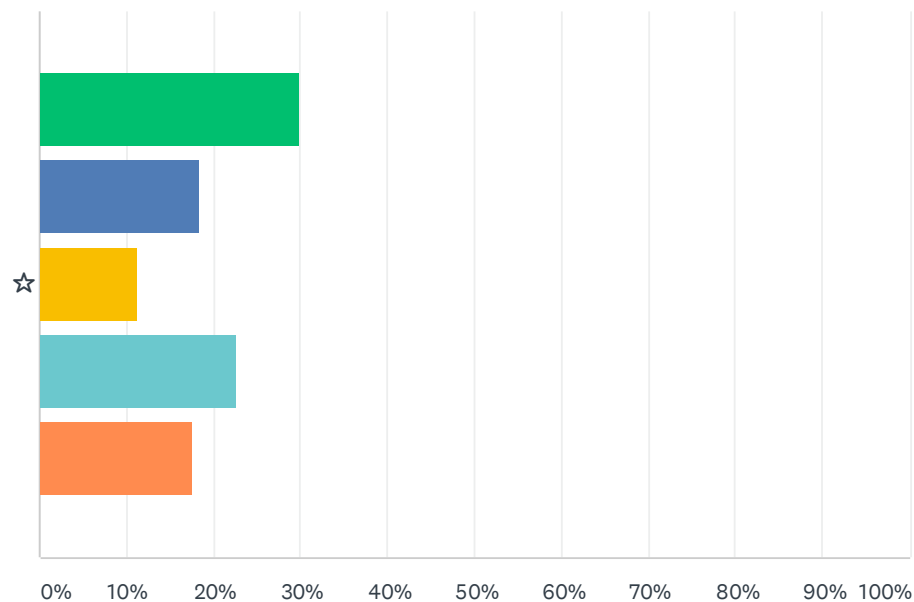

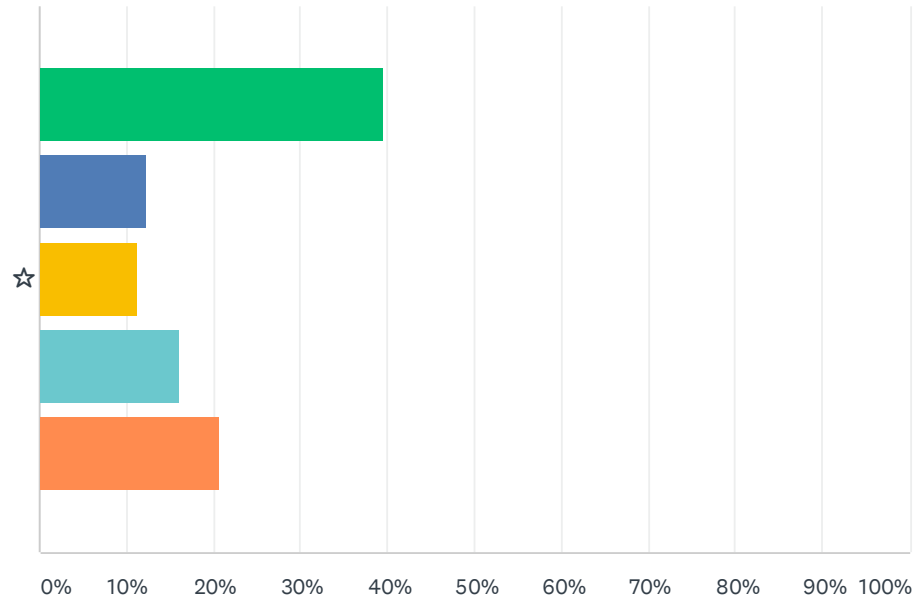

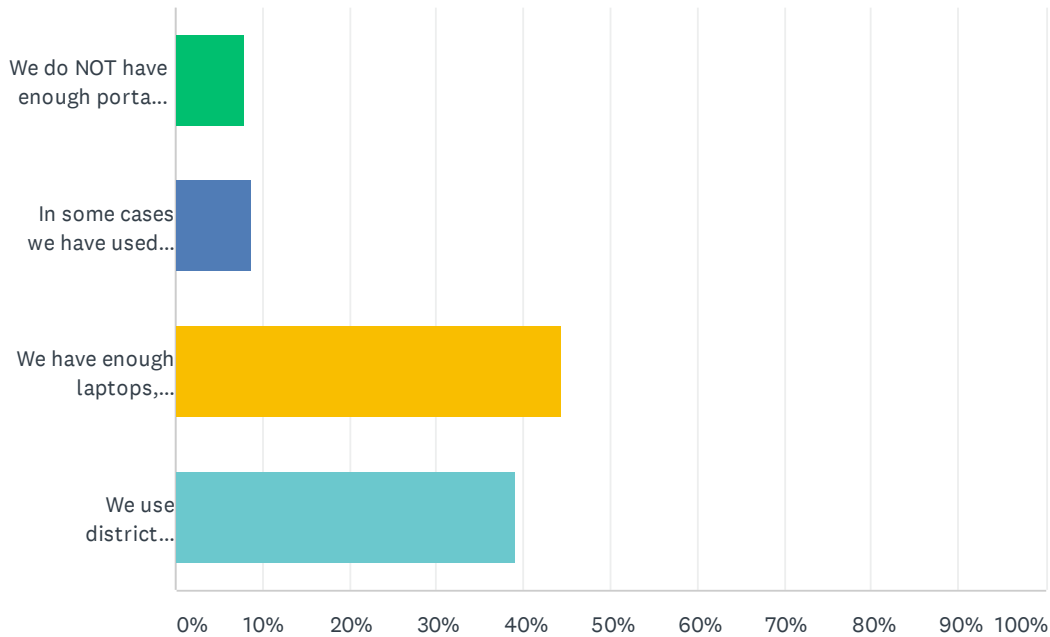

Q9 Which best describes your home and online/virtual learning?

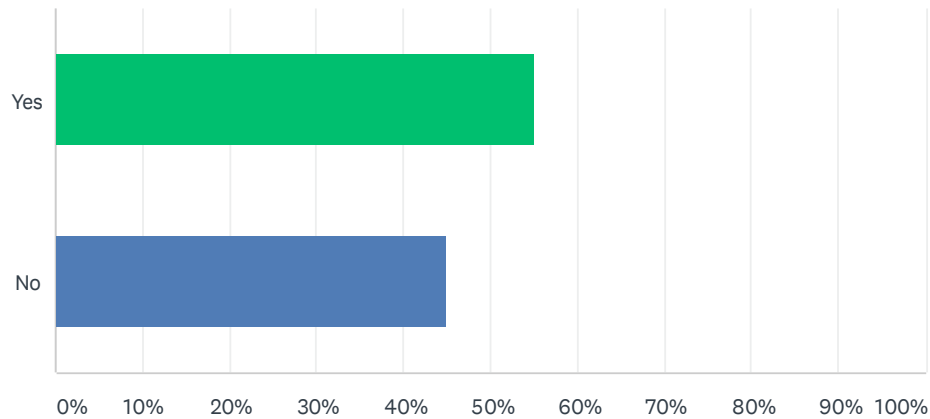

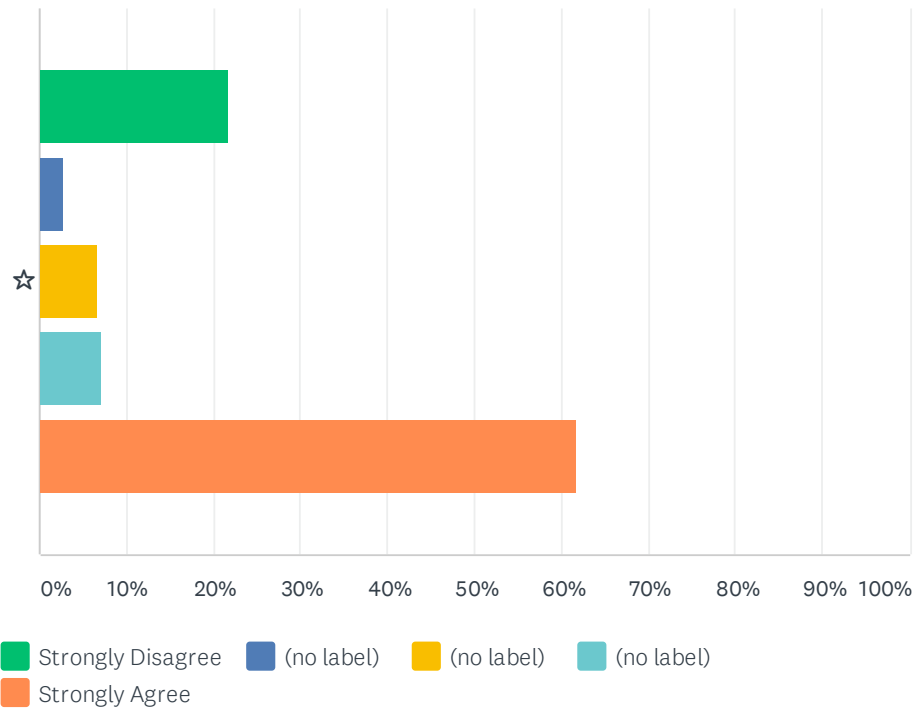

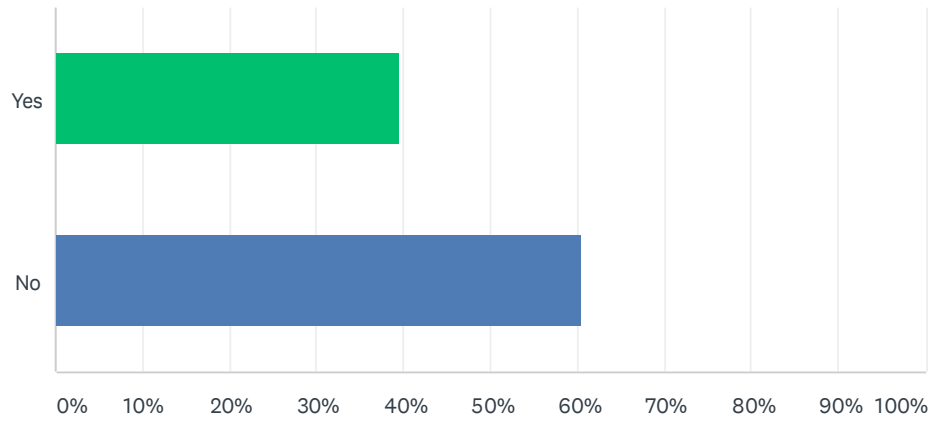
