The Accessing Choices in Education (ACE) grant was designed to allow the Lumbee Tribe to set up a variety of educational options and services from which parents or students can choose. The grant will provide services and programs from October 1, 2021 through September 30, 2025.

The services in red are ONLY for students taking Career & College Promise courses/classes at Robeson Community College.

The services in yellow are for all students in the Lumbee Tribal Service Area of Cumberland, Hoke, Robeson and Scotland counties.

TRANSPORTATION for students attending Robeson Community College (RCC) for the Career & College Promise (CCP) classes, apprenticeships and training programs that lead to industry certifications or college enrollment. The student must be enrolled in the Public Schools of Robeson County.

CULTURALLY RELEVANT SUMMER, AFTER SCHOOL, and SATURDAY CAMPS

will be provided to students that focus on STEM, history, sports and other various topics that have a positive impact on education. The camps may be Summer, Residential, Day, After School, or Saturday camps as listed on the application.

These services are embedded into five different services and are designed to support American Indian students and parents with navigating pertinent educational academic options and overcoming potential barriers to full participation in programs. Students will receive one on one educational academic information, from a qualified staff member, that will enable them to make the most informed choices to meet their education goals.

COLLEGE DAY OR UNIVERSITY & COLLEGE TOURS

This includes visits with college or university administration, academic staff and students to bring awareness to the application process, financial aid, academic resources and campus involvement.
