Qualifications:

- Masters Degree from an accredited University or College degree in Psychology, Social Work, Counseling Education or Human Services field
- Licensed in the State of North Carolina to provide mental health services, (LPC, LSW, LCSW, etc.)

Essential Job Functions:

- 1. Provides direct mental health services to include intake assessment, individual/family/group therapy to assigned clients
- 2. Meets with families and other interested parties in order to exchange necessary information during the assessment/treatment process.
- 3. Acts as client advocate in order to coordinate required services or to resolve emergency problems in crisis situations
- 4. Guides clients in the development of skills and strategies for dealing with identified problems.
- 5. Plans, organizes and leads structured programs of counseling activities for students
- 6. Conducts specialized group therapy as necessary (including but not limited to anger management, bereavement, etc).
- 7. Gathers information about community mental health needs and resources that could be used in conjunction with therapy
- 8. Refers students/family to community resources or to specialists as necessary
- 9. Serves as a Scotland County Schools representative on the Scotland County Systems of Care Collaborative.
- 10. Maintains regular contact with the parent/guardian of each client student
- 11. Provides consultation for school staff and administrators regarding mental health issues of clients (as appropriate)

- 12. Participates in the collection of mental health information and student outcome data to be used for monitoring the overall performance and effectiveness of services provided
- 13. Provides complete and timely documentation to support services rendered
- 14. Attends regularly scheduled department meetings and clinical supervision to ensure appropriate delivery of services
- 15. Learns about new developments and best practices in their field by reading professional literature, attending courses and seminars, and establishing and maintaining contact with other social service agencies
- 16. Other related duties as assigned by the Executive Director of Student Support Services.

Knowledge/Skills:

Must possess a strong knowledge of the common diagnoses and treatments for school-aged children and possess the skills necessary to facilitate positive change in a school environment.
