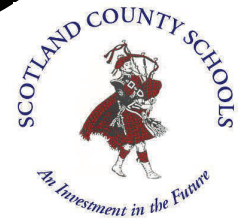


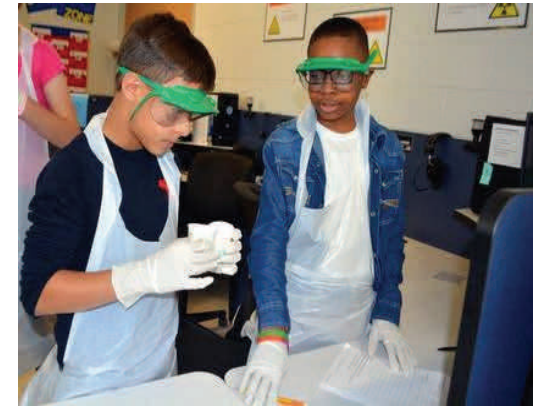
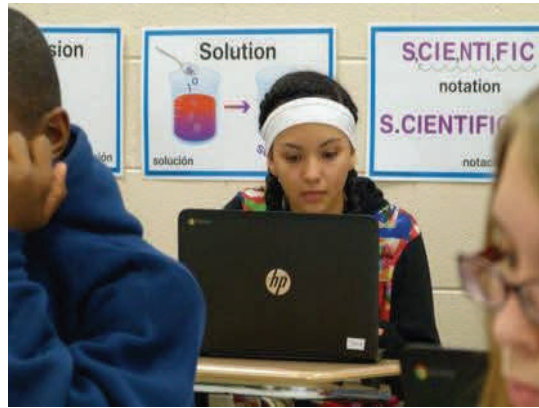

## Gifted Program and Talent Development

Scotland County Schools adapts the Core Curriculum to meet the needs of our Academically and Intellectually Gifted (AIG) students. Cluster programs at the elementary and middle school level have clearly defined curriculum goals that align with principles of differentiation and the North Carolina Course of Study. Cluster classes are led by an AIG certified teachers. Each school in Scotland County offers enrichment opportunities for our AIG students that may include advanced studies, 21st century problem solving, field trips, guest speakers, after school programs, and social/emotional growth opportunities.

The talent development program during grades K-2 as well as the cluster and enrichment programs in grades 3-8 have clearly defined curriculum goals that are aligned with the principles of differentiation. Differentiated pacing guides and units of study are developed by AIG facilitators during the summer months to ensure instruction that is rigorous and relevant for gifted learners.
