REGISTRATION DIRECTIONS

STUDENTS:

Using the posted files on the Scotland High School website, you will complete registration of your elective courses for the 2021 - 2022 school year. Each grade level has their own customized Registration Form. A Worksheet has been provided to check your progress toward graduation. For questions about specific courses, click on the SHS Course Description Guide. Full course descriptions are available for review.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS:

A file has been posted that lists the Graduation Requirements for Scotland County Schools. Students should check their Historical Grades on PowerSchool, checking off completed courses. This will give parents and students a clear view of courses remaining to complete.

ELECTIVE COURSES:

These are courses, other than academics, that a student is interested in pursuing, including Career & Technical courses aligned with job interests, Physical Education courses for those athletically-minded, Fine Arts classes in the Visual and Performing Arts, JROTC, and college - level classes through Richmond Community College.

Students should keep in mind that courses through Richmond Community College have *minimum* Unweighted GPA requirements. Welding and Machining Technology courses require a 2.0 or higher GPA. Associate Degree pathway courses and College Transfer courses require a 2.8 or higher GPA. Students can also qualify through test scores on the PSAT, SAT, or ACT.

DIRECTIONS:

Once finished reviewing grades, students should select the form for the Grade they will be in next year (ie, 9th grade students should select the Rising 10th Grade Registration form, etc.). On the form, you will find a summary of elective course offerings. At the bottom of the page, type in your legal name and PowerSchool number in the spaces provided, then choose your 4 Electives and 2 Alternates from the Drop-down menus provided. Alternate courses will be used in situations where scheduling conflicts prevent a student from getting into one of their 4 primary course selections. Once finished, Click on the Submit button to send in your registration to SHS.

Counselors will meet with students, either face-to-face or through virtual Google Meets, to assist students with their selections. Academic courses will be assigned based on student performance and future plans.

DISCLAIMER:

Course selections may be altered based on student performance in the Spring Semester, ie, a student will not take the advanced level course if they fail the introductory class.
